- ⇒ You can access these resources through the *Business room* on the Library website in My Arcadia.

1. Marketline:

- Type the company name in the search box.
- You can also browse news stories by industry.

2. Lexis Nexis:

- Click on the “News” tab.
- Type the company name in the search box.
- Pick “Business News Publications” from the drop down “Select Sources” menu.

3. ABI Inform:

- Type the company name in the search box.
- Choose the Magazine or Newspapers tab at the top of the search results list.
- You can also limit your search to more scholarly publications.
